*You may have your Man Card restored for exceptional acts of manliness requiring courage, heart or intelligence.



(Continued from page 2) To say that we are excited is an understatement. We are looking forward to working with family and the celebration of God's wonderful gift of uniting us together. The Gospel reading we are planning on having for our wedding is from John 1. We love the creative power that God has in His Word and the redemption he provides through Christ. The imagery that is used in this passage is beautiful as we are reminded of light entering darkness, the Word and its force, the bridge between the unseen to the seen world as we are given a glimpse into the heavenly story unfolding. The Word does that which we strive to understand, it dwells in human flesh. This Word proclaims truth and grace. This Word gives life. Naomi and I pray that this Word will dwell in us richly and that it will continue to be our source for truth and grace. We ask that you please pray for us as we transition into this new phase of our lives as husband and wife. There will be much adjustment, and we look to our Creator for His guidance and light. I would like to look back at 2019 and reflect upon the many blessings that have taken place. Exodus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy were consultant checked in the Spring and we have almost finished team checking Judges (my time in the US hasn't allowed for that continued checking as I hoped). They were a blessing and will continue to be a blessing to the work that I will do as an exegete, linguist, and researcher. I was able to take Ethnographic Research and Design; Semantics and Pragmatics; Theory and Practice of Translation; and Hebrew Textual Analysis. While being here on campus I have been able to meet and get some help from well seasoned veterans in linguistics, anthropology, Hebrew, information technology (IT) and more! One IT man who has helped with formatting lectionaries in Cameroon has been on campus this Fall and he graciously helped me one afternoon see how to delve deeper into formatting features and
