Pressing on Toward the Goal

Dear Friends in Christ,

Imagine you're a college football player in your senior year on a big 10 team, Ohio State. You've planned your life on getting in the pro football ranks. You chose the school with the best fit for your style, the one with the best chance at a national championship and you gave 100% of your effort for the past three years to the team. Now, it's all come apart because the conference cancelled football for this season. No chance at a national championship. No chance at winning a personal national honor based on performance. A total guess what the pro's will think of your talent and skill after a year off. It's a future that has turned weak and bleak. Some of the very top-rated seniors are sitting out at schools that are playing for fear that they'll get sick and have heart or lung damage for life. But you're not them. You needed that final year to mature and make your mark. How onerous is that! The life-changing effects of the covid-19 pandemic laid waste to many young people's dreams built on earthly achievement – riches, power, and prestige. St. Paul's letter to the Philippians realizes how

the temptations of the world's glory and comfort put us as humans in a race to get all we can. But, he lays out a different race that isn't subject to world events – not even a world-wide pandemic that upsets every person's life.

This race is not athletic, not a power game, or a contest for a prestigious position. Paul's personal testimony is that, **“straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.”** Paul has latched onto the overarching goal of God's calling you to live in his kingdom, to be an heir with Christ Jesus, to have his holiness as a forgiven child of God.

The incredible part of this wonderful state of reward is the way you make it there. It's not what you do – at all! It's simply that Jesus Christ has done it all *for you*. That's what Paul means when he says, **“I do not consider that I have made it [righteousness] my own.”**

In his former life as a Pharisee among Pharisees – he strove to accomplish being

the best of the best at living a perfect life. But it was all for nothing – serving the wrong goal, perfection (unreachable). Like many long-time Christians, you may be thinking, blah, blah blah – tell me something I don't already know. Paul's message is totally relevant for us, though.

In this time of pandemic and riots and social restructuring, we all feel like we've lost a lot! Many of us have lost much – from a whole host of angles. We're counting what we've lost, though, in earthly ways. Sure, we can't diminish our losses. They are real. And ... they are not the utmost goal we live by as people of God. Our top goal is simply living for God the rest of our life with the sure knowledge that heaven is our home because the love of God has spoken. Jesus has done it all. We live in his grace, today!

May you and I focus not where we've been; but on what God has in store for us. Especially that he has righteousness, heaven and life in his kingdom for you and me as his gift. Whatever adjustments we are making to keep going in this life, we can find



comfort that God has already factored in the good and the bad that we're experiencing. So, let the **“upward call of God in Christ Jesus”** be foremost in your mind as you constantly “pray, praise and give thanks to God in all things.” Amen.


