#### Our Precious Sacraments - Visible Grace

Dear Friends in Christ,

A man facing terminal cancer told his Lutheran pastor that he was sad to be headed for hell because he had not only missed church for 25 years, but had openly refused every encouragement by his family to join them at services. He felt that these sins against the Third Commandment would damn him, overwhelming any good works he had done through the years. After finding that the man was baptized as and infant and had an active faith life as a child, the pastor pronounced forgiveness for confessed sins and pointed to his baptism as a daily reminder of his salvation. This man found out the meaning of being baptized into Christ – the assurance of heaven! Have you ever wondered what makes Lutheran beliefs precious? Some people love their church be-

cause of the relationships they have there. Others love their church because it is the family religion, passed down from Mom and/or Dad. A few love the church for the pastor. Alongside the cross of suffering that brings salvation, Lutheran hold the sacraments' in very high esteem. Not to worship them, but to value the grace they impart to us that our physical senses can experience. Those who come into the Lutherans church from other faith backgrounds see the precious gift others take for granted - the gift of forgiveness through Baptism and the Lord's Supper in tangible form. We feel the water and hear the Word. We touch and taste the bread and the wine, his very body and blood given for our salvation. These are undeserved gifts from God that many denominations do not have in their belief systems. Too many of them see mere symbolism in the sacraments, denying their power to save and pronounce it objectively to us. Now when you hear the siren song of false teaching that the only important thing in a church is to believe Jesus is your Savior, you can realize that the sacraments may well be missing in other churches. Missing is the constant assurance that you are saved by grace received in Baptism ... that you are forgiven through Christ in the Lord's Supper. How sad for so many to be left wondering about a future in heaven! Lutherans cling tightly to our precious Savior, raised form the dead so that we are saved. We cling to our Baptism as



physical evidence that we are saved. And we cling to the Lord's Supper that brings us forgiveness and strengthens our faith.

#### Rev. Jason & Anna with their sons Johanes and Immanuel


Dear friends and family would like to introduce Missionaries,

#### **Lenten Midweek Services**

Lent started February 22 and so does our midweek sermon series on Moses' most important book—Exodus. In it Moses asks Pharaoh to let God's people go seven times (Exodus 5:1; 7:16; 8:1, 20; 9:1, 13; 10:3) and Pharaoh finally does it! When he does, God's salvation is so amazing that the event becomes the Gospel of the Old Testament. The exodus is mentioned 125 times in Israel's Scriptures! Throughout the book of Exodus God reveals who he is through his absence and his presence, through his silence and his speech, through his wrath and his mercy, and through his judgment and his amazing grace.
