

Independence Day

Dear Friends in Christ,

MISSOURI SYNOD

Many countries celebrate some sort of holiday remembering their independence from being part of a larger nation. July 4th marks Independence Day for the United States of America. We celebrate that holiday so that we never forget the price paid in human life to secure that liberty. Our nation is founded on personal and national freedom from so many things. Freedom of religion is one of them that has gotten very confusing in its application in the last few years. We are absolutely free from a stateprescribed, world religion, such as Islam, in a number of countries. Yet, the level of oppression we Christians experience from government and other groups continues to grow. Some have felt like freedom of religion applies to any religion except Christianity. So, the USA is the flagship of what it means to be a free country: just ask Yakof Smirnoff, naturalized citizen formerly of the Soviet Union. His Branson theater

show is one of the most conservative, patriotic that I've ever seen! He has great freedom in this country compared to his old country. They were like slaves in many ways. If you've seen his act, you'd unquestionably agree we are free, not slaves to any person!

Yet, many Americans are slaves to the greatest evils - sin, death and the devil. Gladly, we believers are free from slavery to sin and the total control of lives by evil. This comment may seem harsh, but it is so true. The truth is understanding that the only *good* thing is pleasing God. So, anything that we might label as "good" done by an unbeliever is not truly "good," but done for selfish or evil reasons. As Christians, we know the Independence Day is this: good that pleases God and can choose to do those things. That means we are independent of the total control and depravity of the evil one or our sinful nature. We can thoughtful-

ly choose to do the good and say no to the bad. Our ability to choose the good comes at the highest price in human life every paid to free a people. The price was the life of Jesus Christ. "By this we know love, that he laid down his life for us," 1 John 3.16a. "Us" in this case refers to all people of the world, though only those who believe that he died for their sins receive God's forgiveness that gives them heaven as a free gift. If you are following the line of reasoning here, we Christians have independence to act by choice because of Jesus conquering death on Easter – the human independence day from Satan and eternal death.

The final way to think of you can also remember your personal independence day in your Baptism, when your sins were washed away through the death and resurrection of Jesus. You are marked, dear Christian,



as a child of God, free from Satan's power to enslave you to his will. Free to reject your own sinful thoughts from within yourself. May God bless your holiday this July and beyond as you celebrate your independence as a believer in Jesus Christ - your life in the kingdom of God! Amen.
