Reconciling

Dear Friends in Christ.

Back in 2015, this church learned the difference between reconciliation and conflict resolution when a majority of the members attended a Bible study by that name. The people were so moved by it that they chose reconciliation as a service we would do for ourselves and the public as an outreach. They appreciated the change in their hearts and saw the need to share it. In our sin-tainted world, we have a strange way of viewing the term "reconcile." The dictionary's first definition for the verb says "restore friendly relations between." But then the explanatory example is to "settle" as in a quarrel. That's leaves a lot of ground open for relationships to remain quite fractured. In reality, we intend that relationships are back to the way they were before ... or even better – perhaps having grown stronger through the struggle.

So how can it end up less than ideal?

Think about a lawsuit settled by a judge. Does the losing party accept the judge's ruling completely and things go back? Not very often. Usually the loser feels she got less than deserved and continues to blame the winning party.

What about an employer and a union in negotiations for a labor contract? When they settle on terms, do they treat each other openly and honestly? Two Christian persons develop a conflict between them. They each send a note forgiving the other. But they each refuse to ever speak to the other again. Does forgiven mean that their relationship is restored? When I read about these examples it became clear that our society suffers from the devil's lies about reconciling. These seem more like a truce than peace. We can do better than the result these examples portray. We can move to Biblical, godly reconciling that goes all the way to restoration. The guise we fall into goes back to Adam and Eve's encounter with Satan. Blame, deception, lies and denial get in the way of true confession of each specific sin followed by declaration of forgiveness by the other person. When the other person knows their hurt is recognized and felt and regretted, then the path to full, restorative forgiveness is on its

way to happening. Conversely, the apologies offered are often vague, insincere, incomplete ... even offered at a distance (like media). They usually get undermined by justifying words like "but, yet, when, or still" that take back the apology just offered. Like Adam's example, "Yes, I'm sorry I ate the forbidden fruit, but she gave it to me. And you gave that woman to me." Feeble. Blaming. Selfjustifying!

Thankfully, when God was reconciling us to himself, he didn't let our feeble confessions get in the way of our forgiveness. Our heavenly Father willingly sent his son to be born a human, to suffer and die and rise again all to reconcile the sins of the world., "that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation." (2 Cor. 5:19, ESV) When God reconciles with us, he treats us as if we never trespassed against him. Never! God forgives us completely and treats us with love like that of a dear father for a child. He trusts us as his messengers of reconciliation.



We have much work to do in order to improve our reconciling ways, dear brothers and sisters. Certainly, we would like to be more like Jesus. I encourage you to get back to the reconciling lifestyle we uncovered, which has become our brand, Trinity Life. In addition, we are restarting the church here, so we should be inviting friends to come help us build this exciting new church based on our unique Christian lifestyle – not judgy, just forgiven. May God bless you to embrace confession and forgiveness in every relationship! Amen.
