Dreams of Restoring School Prayer

Dear Friends in Christ,

I started public school in the 6th grade, having attended the Lutheran school up to that time. San Jacinto intermediate had about 600 kids! My homeroom teacher was Mr. Balucek, my guide in the huge new world. The school day began with a band student playing reveille on a cornet, another student leading the pledge of Allegiance, morning announcements, and closed with a student saying a prayer over the PA system. Student-led school prayer was a given in the 60s. Homeroom classes rotated weekly responsibility for the morning program. When our classes' turn came up, Mr. Balucek simply went down the row of kids, assigning the first to lead the pledge, the next to read announcements, and the third to say a prayer into the sound room microphone in the school office. Some kids might express fear when their assignment came up, but we were all shocked when Steve claimed he didn't know how to pray. Every other kid in our classroom of 26 kids raised their hands to the teacher's question, "Who

has ever said a prayer?" Poor Steve got the third degree from the kids and teacher as we all tried to be in the sixth grade without having ever prayed. In those days, most people had exposure to church or Sunday school. After all, it was only a few years after the immensely popular Bishop Fulton Sheen's TV show had gone away. Things were changing quickly, though, to protect kids like Steve from ever being embarrassed by Christians again. By the time I got to high school, prayer had been replaced by "a time for silent meditation."

Today's school openings rarely even have a time set aside for silent mediation, much less prayer. Prayer is even rare opening football games, when it used to be the norm. It was when I moved here 19 years ago. Do we long for the good ole days when prayer was accepted, tolerated, and even encouraged? Yes! Yet, only our Christian political voice can overcome the Supreme Court

rulings that undermine our public prayer. A case already came down from them allowing a coach to figure out how a person got pray with the team before a game. We pray that the right case might bring school prayer before the current, more conservative supreme court that might reverse the ruling and allow prayer in lots of public settings. Thank God for NAS-CAR or else people today wouldn't know what it is like to have public prayer before a sports event. Christian tradition guides us to pray before meals, journeys, events, beginnings and endings, along with many other times. In Acts 21. Paul is headed to Jerusalem for a confrontation with his opposition and stops at Tyre, where he visits with disciples. When Paul's group is leaving, the families all go to see them off and pray together. What a great time to pray and lay out a tradition for us! We have this great gift from God -- his promise to hear every prayer said by a believer. We know that prayer makes a difference in our lives and destinies because

My prayer is that you pray often. And I request that you pray for your pastor each day. It will make me a better pastor, while you become a more faithful steward of God's gift of prayer.
