Reformation Meals, Lutheran Style

Dear Friends in Christ,

A couple is sitting at the dinner table, enjoying a quiet evening meal and conversation. One says to the other, "What did you do today?" The other replies, "Not much. How about you?" to which the first says, "Me neither. Typical day, isn't it." "Yep." It's the end of the work day and neither person has done anything worthy of even sharing! Still the conversation is about tasks and acts of "doing." Maybe this task orientation is about our need to feel we're accomplishing something - working towards a goal. Perhaps there's just something in us that likes to focus on doing and done things -- works. And then, there's good works ...

Whether good works are required was controversial and new when the Lutheran perspective on the Reformation of the church launched like a rocket with Rev. Dr. Martin Luther nailing *The 95 Theses* for theo-

logical debate to the chapel believing that his salvific door. The crux of his points is often summed up only work required for us in his three "solas" (Latin for "only") They are: 1) only through faith, 2) only by grace, and 3) only through Scripture. That contrasts the opposing position that held a person must display good works to be saved. Luther stood behind Eph. 2:8-9 that says salvation comes by grace through faith, not by works.

In no time, the Roman Catholic and Reformed churches lined up with the good works required camp, leaving Lutherans the leading group holding fast to salvation by faith alone through grace alone, as promised by scripture alone.

Around this region, I find many people that agree with both positions, as unfeasible as that might seem. We see the positions as opposed. Nonetheless, for us, we glorify Jesus in

work on the cross is the to be forgiven. That's because we believe the scriptures that point to us being against God, unable to believe or even give assent to what he has done. Faith comes to us as a pure and free gift from the Holy Spirit. So, our feeling saved or having decided for Christ can only come after God's saving grace has put faith in our hearts. It's not dependent on us deciding. For Lutherans, this the heart of the Reformation we will celebrate at the end of this month. May we glorify God for his gracious gift of faith. For in that we have full assurance of forgiveness, eternal life, and salvation. Thank you, Martin Luther, for helping us see the sure way. Reformation Sunday, this year will have a bonus celebration - the 75th Anniversary of Trinity Lutherans Church, McAlester/Krebs.



We'll be thanking God for the 75 years of Lutheran worship ministry here with a special afternoon worship service. And in the Lutheran tradition, a free meal will be served after the service. We started this letter with a dinner conversion story and now we're all set for recounting old stories of doing while making a new story. Now that's something to talk about over dinner! Amen.


