How Can I Pray for You?

Dear Friends in Christ.

In the Bible story of Job, God destroys all of Job's children and grandchildren, his wealth and even his health. His closest friends come and sit with him, in repeated attempts to comfort him. They presume his misfortune is punishment from God for some horrendous wrong he has done and urge him to confess it.

Have you ever felt like everything and everybody had turned against you? Have you even pondered that God may be punishing you and had even abandoned you? We have the story of Job to comfort us in such times. God did not punish him. His three wellmeaning friends ... were just wrong. In the end, God admonishes the erring friends: "Now therefore take seven bulls and seven rams and go to my servant Job and offer up a burnt offering for yourselves. And my servant Job shall pray for you, for I will accept his prayer not to deal

with you according to your folly. For you have not spoken of me what is right, as my servant Job has."" (Job 42:8, ESV) The italics are mine to emphasize God's resolution, having someone pray for another. One of the powerful gifts Christian's have is the ability to pray to God on behalf of another person. Just Week, we remember Jesus' example of praying for the soldiers that crucified him on the cross (Luke 23:34). We marvel that he could still love the ones who treated him so. Yet, he died for their sins - gave his life for them, too! Such love kept him on that cross. We can show our love for meet to ask: "How can I others by praying for them, as Jesus did. There is no more powerful demonstration of our loving care and concern for someone than to say: "How can I pray for you, now?" Just imagine how

the people you meet each day might be changed if you asked each one: "How can I pray for you?" Then consider, if everyone in our church family did that? We know from James 5: 16, "the prayer of a faithful person has great power." Continuous, ongoing and fervent prayer has the power to do great miracles in the lives of the having gone through Holy people for whom we pray. In the season of Easter, 7 weeks following the day, I challenge you to commit yourself to the Lord as his prayer warrior. People all around us have feelings like Job, needing support from friends and assurance from God. Make it your practice in every conversation with every person you pray for you, right now?" In so doing, you will spread the love of Jesus far and wide as you touch hearts for him. You will be transformed into a more caring person and God will come closer to you as



your prayers rise to him. If we all do this, our church will change overnight in the same way. God will bless such prayer, as he promises, with joy and peace. So, let us keep the Easter joy in faith and prayer, displaying our loving relationship with Jesus and all the people we meet! Amen.


